Graduation Requirements

At PHS all students are given the opportunity to earn their high school diploma by completing the following requirements:

225 Credits which consist of the following:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Math (Alg 1 required)
- 3 years of Science (Life/Physical)
- 1 year of World History
- 1 year of US History
- 1 semester of Government
- 1 semester of Economics
- 2 years of Physical Education
- 1 year of a Fine Art
- 1 year of a Foreign Language
- Electives that accumulate to 55 credits.

FAFSA/CADAA Completion – All seniors must complete their financial aid application as part of the graduation guidelines.

Counselors meet with students routinely to go over their four year plan and all graduation requirements.

A-G Requirements

All PHS Students are given the opportunity to be A-G Certified so they can attend a four-year university.

To be certified a student must complete the following A-G Guidelines:

- A – History/Social Science – Two Years
- B – English – Four Years
- C – Mathematics – Three Years
- D – Science – Two years
- E – Foreign Language – Two Years
- F – Visual/Performing Arts – One Year
- G – College Prep Elective – One year

Meeting these requirements allow PHS students to apply to a four year university.

Perris High is one of a few schools that offers the JROTC Program: JROTC is a national program designed to motivate young people to be better citizens. They instill leadership skills, offer a rich learning environment, and give cadets the opportunities they need to realize their full potential. Numerous hands on, physical activities such drilling, marching and team sports. JROTC is an elective and counts as a p.e. credit.

Perris FFA



Future Farmers of America – Perris High School is one of several unique schools that has an award winning program called Perris FFA: Students can fulfill their Science requirements for graduation and college entrance through this program with an emphasis on Agriculture. The FFA also offers students opportunities to attend leadership conferences, competitions, work with animals and numerous field trips all over California.



PHS offers several CTE pathways and programs for student who can earn a trait that they can either use immediately out of high school for employment or for career planning in higher education:

CTE Medical – 2 yr program that will certify a student to work at an entry-level medical position.

CTE Digital Film – 2 to 3 yr program where a student learns the fundamentals of Video and Film Production, can earn college credit, and takes part in internships.

CTE Automotive – 2 to 3 yr program that teaches the basics of automotive and better prepares student for employment in the automotive industry.

CTE Int. Cuisine- 2 to 3 yr program involving cooking, food safety, and sanitation which will certify a student to secure employment in the food industry.

Photography – 2 to 3 yr program where students learn the intricacies of the photography, so they can begin a career in that field.

Computer Programming – up to a 3 yr program where the student learns the fundamentals of Computer Programming for future careers in the technology industry and possibly earn college credit.

PLTW Biomedical Pathway – a rigorous and relevant four-course sequence that allows students to investigate the roles of biomedical professionals as they study the concepts of human medicine, physiology, genetics, microbiology, and public health.
